Back to School "In Style" Shopping Spree

Offers school attire, school supplies, personal hygiene items to students who are selected by counselors. School Districts are rotated and students must be in Jr. High.

Day of Caring - Project FreshStart

Mobilizes hundreds of volunteers to assemble school supplies for 3,300 9th graders. Counselors distribute supplies to eligible students.

Emergency Disaster Relief Grant

Supports initiatives that address disaster relief, through partnerships with counties, school districts and the American Red Cross.

Transportation Vouchers

Free vouchers made available to those without a vehicle needing to access services in four areas: medical, job training/employment, support services and education.

VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance)

IRS advanced trained Volunteers, provide free tax preparation services for individuals who earn \$60,000 a year or less at sixteen sites.

Youth Leadership Mentorship Program

Empowering Juniors and Freshmen with leadership skills, soft skills, volunteer opportunities and financial literacy training. School counselors identify the students who participate as mentees and mentors.
